Governance

On 11 July 2016, the former Secretary of the Department of Environment and Heritage Trade Peter N Varghese AO was appointed as the first Chair of the UQ Governance Board. Dr James Wilton acted as Chair from 1 January to 10 July, before resigning from the position on 11 November 2016.

Global excellence

In 2016, the excellence of UQ research was recognised at a number of international events.

The 15th MBA Awards of Australia and the Asia-Pacific and World Enterprise Awards in America.

UQ was awarded the Global Viewpoint (GV8), a significant award of Australia's research and innovation excellence and was recognised at UQ Vice-Chancellor and President Professor Peter Høj's inauguration in 2017.

UQ was awarded the Australian Academy of Science Research Award 2016 (AAAS) and the UQ Research Centre for the Environment (UCE) was recognised at UQ's 2016 Research Excellence Awards. Learning excellence

UQ is ranked in the top 1% of Australian and international universities for teaching excellence in the 2016. Five UQ academics were ranked in the top 100 of the Australian Student Learning Awards: Dr Saeed Aminossadati, Dr Lance Newey, Dr Phil Orchard, Professor Kenneth Pakenham, and Dr Judith Seaboyer. Professor Paul Mills was awarded the Excellence in Biological Science, Health and Related Studies and the University of Australia and the Pacific Award for Excellence in Learning: the Pro Bono Centre for the Education of the Community and the University of the Pacific award, and UQ Three Minute Thesis of the Pacific Graduate Education.

Parasitology was named the 2016 Health Faculty Award. Dr Emma Beckman, first of the School of Health, Behaviour and Society.
